
There's just one more thing ... Here's what you should bring.

- Elbow and/or knee pads





SEVEN PRINCIPLES OF LEAVE NO TRACE

1. Know Before You Go

Pack what you might need, and learn about where you are going.

2. Choose the Right Path

Be safe: Don't wander off the main trail alone. Allow small trees and flowers to grow by not stepping on them.

3. Trash Your Trash

"Pack it in, pack it out."

4. Leave What You Find

So others can enjoy it and wildlife can use it.

5. Be Careful With Fire

Be sure it's OK to build a fire where you're visiting. Make sure fires are completely out before you leave.

6. Respect Wildlife

Observe animals from a distance, and do not feed them.

7. Be Kind to Other Visitors

If you are quiet, everyone will observe more wildlife.
