Novara wisely specs a steel fork. Sure, it's a little pudgier than an aluminum model, but it helps soak up potholes and curb drops.

The oversize 7005 aluminum tubes are stiff and responsive, just the thing for dodging cabs and sprinting through traffic lights—green ones, of course.

Hayes's MX2 mechanical discs are stupid-simple to set up and provide gobs of power.

Leave your bike shoes at home: The Buzz's fat platform pedals beg a pair of Converse All Stars. And they're just the ticket for perfecting your stoplight trackstands.

What's missing from this picture? The Buzz is two chainrings short of a full deck. The single lever and derailleur give the bike a clean, uncluttered look, but lack the versatility a trio of front chainrings provides.

A Truvativ ISIS Drive bottom bracket and 5D crank ensure that every precious bit of pedaling energy goes straight to the pavement.
